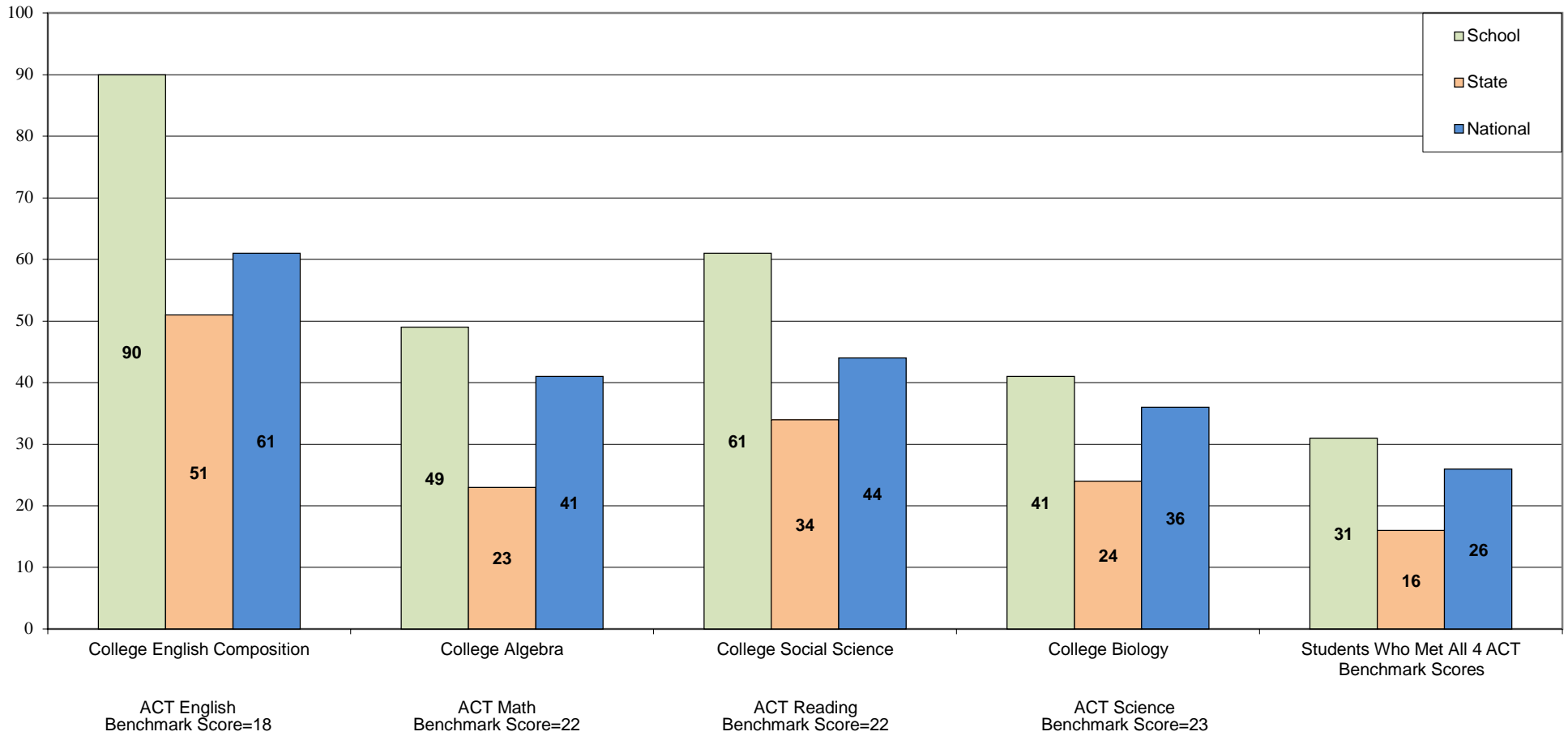


Figure 1.1. Percent of Your Students Ready for College-Level Coursework
