In Geo	rge Orwell's 1984, characters respond in different ways to the oppressive political and socia

hierarchy enforced by the Party. Choose one character—such as Winston, Julia, or O'Brien—and write a well-developed paragraph analyzing how that character's response to the Party's control contributes to an overall interpretation of the novel. Focus on how his or her actions and attitudes reflect Orwell's topics, such as power, resistance, or the loss of individuality. Avoid simply summarizing the plot; instead, explain how the character's response helps reveal the novel's deeper message.

Prompt #2:

In George Orwell's 1984, deception plays a major role in the Party's control over individuals. Choose a character who engages in deception, and write a well-developed paragraph analyzing the motives behind his or her dishonesty. Consider whether the deception is meant to help or harm, and explain how it contributes to the novel's larger topics, such as manipulation, betrayal, or the distortion of truth. Avoid summarizing the plot; focus instead on how the character's deception deepens the novel's overall meaning.

Prompt #3:

"And, after all, our surroundings influence our lives and characters as much as fate, destiny or any agency." -Pauline Hopkins, <i>Contending Forces</i> In George Orwell's 1984, the cultural and physical surroundings of the Party's dystopian society deeply shape the thoughts, behaviors, and moral choices of its characters. Choose a character and write a well-developed paragraph analyzing how the oppressive environment of constant surveillance, propaganda, and fear influences that character's psychological or moral traits. Explain how this influence helps reveal a central topic of the novel, such as the loss of individuality, the dangers of totalitarianism, or the manipulation of truth. Avoid merely summarizing the plot; instead, focus on how the character's environment shapes his or her inner life and contributes to the novel's meaning.
